Regarding rules on maximum brightness of headlights and new adaptive lighting technology.

There have been numerous instances of oncoming vehicles with LED lights blinding me. This is a serious issue as I do not have eye problems, yet some vehicles cause temporary blindness after passing. It causes black spots in the visual field. More relevant, is the conditions when 3 vehicles with excessive lights produce a wide field blind spot. Upon such conditions, it would not matter if it was a pedestrian or a moose in between the offending parties and me, or any other driver who ends up in a sight of 2 or more vehicles with excessive headlights.

I will add that you should consider such obviously flawed engineering. I usually encounter at least one such vehicle every 5 minutes in a suburban environment where blinding can easily lead to death to a pedestrian on a road, or in a forested area to the impact of an animal and potential multiple deaths.

Please proceed with the regulatory framework and also consider issuance of rules that would force local bodies to address existing violations.
